MUSEUM PROJECT UPDATE**



The AMC Museum staff has replaced more than two dozen display mannequins with state-of-the-art mannequins, thanks to a \$20,000 appropriation from the Foundation.



Last year, on Veterans Day, the museum marked the dedication of a POW/MIA Chair of Honor. The exhibit was created from a C-5A Galaxy flight engineer's chair to honor all prisoners war and those missing in action from all America's wars.



Full-time restoration work is continuing on our KB-50J. Adapted as a refueler from the B-50 bomber, which in turn evolved from the B-29 of World War II, the KB-50J filled a huge void in air refueling capabilities during the early part of the Cold War.

A Foundation expenditure of \$27,000 was made for a much-needed forklift in the museum aircraft restoration department.

Other projects included:

- A new Korean War exhibit is being constructed, along with other displays being updated
- The education building, that hosts the Museum's Summer Camp program for children, is taking on a new look
- The Museum staff created a new display area around the World War II-era B-17F Flying Fortress
- The Foundation provided 22 aircraft restoration volunteers with steel toe safety boots



It's creating new exhibits, preserving aircraft with such special histories, and providing educational opportunities that make it so satisfying to be Museum staff, Museum volunteers, and Foundation members. We're still working hard, along with the staff and those volunteers, to keep our museum as the "must-see" attraction in the state of Delaware.
